2006 Nottinghamshire County Championship

The date and venue for the 2006 County Championship have now been fixed: the event will take place at the Beeston Youth and Community Centre, West End, Beeston, Nottingham NG9 IGL on 21-22 October (ignore what was said about the date in the last issue - booking a venue this side of Christmas on any other date was a non-starter). The venue is a spacious hall a short distance from the centre of Beeston, with plenty of parking space. It's just 5 minutes by foot from Beeston bus station and 10 minutes walk from Beeston railway station.

We have changed the format of the competition slightly so that everyone has a chance to win a title. There will be four sections:

- Open
- Under 150
- Under 125
- Under 100

The winner of each section will be the Nottinghamshire County Champion for that grading bracket. There will also be junior prizes and a number of other prizes to keep everyone involved up to the final round. The entry fee will be £10 per player - a significant reduction on previous events. Full details, as well as entry forms, will be available shortly.

The aim is to revitalise the competition and make it an essential date in the calendar for Nottinghamshire's players. Put the date in your diary now and make your plans!

County captains needed

As many of you know, last season's county teams were organised by Neil Graham (U150 and U125B), Derek

Cronshaw (U125A) and Michael Barnes (U100). Neil and Michael, in particular, went far beyond what the county's players might reasonably expect, with each of them captaining a team for which they were not qualified to play.

This season, Neil is staying on as U150 captain, but captains are needed for the UI25 (just one team this season) and UI00 teams. Tony Wright is looking into the possibility of running an U175 team, while David Levens is in charge of finding the other two captains.

It's not reasonable (except in an emergency) to expect people to captain a team that they can't play for, so volunteers are needed from the ranks of people who played for the teams last season. Over 50 people played for the U125 teams last year and 25 played for the U100 team; even if you remove the juniors from the equation, that's still a sizeable pool of candidates.

If you played in either of the two competitions last year, you can expect a phone call soon to ask you to be captain. Or you could short circuit the process by stepping forward now. An email to president@nottschess.org would do the trick.

The league handbook for 2006–07, including the season's fixtures, will be posted to all club secretaries by the end of this week (they're sitting in a box beside me now). If your club's package doesn't arrive next week, please let me know.

The net loss of three teams from the league (Long Eaton 2 and 3, Fiveways 2 and Bunkers 4 out; West Nottingham 7 in) has resulted in a restructuring of the league by the LMC. There are still five divisions, but now arranged in an 88887 structure instead of last year's 98889. West Nottingham 2

and Mansfield 2 missed out on promotion as a consequence; Nomads 3 were reprieved from relegation.
