West Nottingham 5 were not relegated from, and University 4 were promoted to, Division 4 as a result of the increased number of teams.

There are various things that I'd like to draw to your attention:

- ◆ Ashfield will play all their home matches on Wednesdays at the Summit Centre.
- ◆ Submission of results: The Rules Revision Meeting approved changes to rule B14, to allow the official result to be submitted by email. Results may be sent to the Records Secretary (see p. 2) either by email or by post on the result card. Both captains are now responsible for submitting the result (since the opposing captain cannot sign your email), and a full set of result cards is attached, either to send in or just record the result on the night, for later copying to email. Where both teams submit results by post it is OK for them to sign and the home team submit the record card, as previously.
- ◆ Out-County players: Rule C6(b) has been amended. Prior LMC approval will now only be required for new Out-County players graded or of estimated strength over 150.
- ◆ Please note the Rules Guidance from the LMC on the inside back page.
- ◆ Following discussion at the Rules Revision Meeting, the LMC approved the following statement on disabled access:

'As a voluntary measure for 2008/09, where clubs are unable to provide wheelchair access and opponents give I month's notice of the wish to play a wheelchair player they are requested to play the board in question away, or at a suitable alternative venue, and prior to the main match.'

- ◆ Promotion and relegation, while notionally two up, two down, depend to a large extent on the number of league entries received, and the LMC cannot guarantee how many teams will actually be promoted and relegated from each division. The LMC will attempt to promote divisional champions where practicable.
- ◆ The LMC does not accept the inability to raise a team as a sufficient reason to postpone a match. Because of the two-point penalty for defaulting a match, it is in your interests to fulfil your fixtures even if you cannot raise a full team.
- ◆ All matters to be referred to the LMC should be directed to the League Secretary in the first instance.

Finally, please check your team's fixtures carefully to ensure that there are no errors or omissions.

Rules

Schedule A: Administration

- I The Nottinghamshire Chess League shall be controlled by a League Management Committee (LMC) elected at the AGM of the NCA, consisting of a League Secretary, a Records Secretary, 5 members and 3 reserves. The LMC shall:
 - (a) Elect a chairman, who shall have a vote and a casting vote
 - (b) Organise the league into such divisions as circumstances permit and compile a fixture list
 - (c) Arbitrate on all disputes, its decisions being final, and publish its decisions and interpretations
 - (d) Distribute to clubs, at least 14 days before the start of the season, match result cards and the fixtures handbook.

2 LMC Meetings:

- (a) No club may be represented by more than one member, except when the League Secretary and Records Secretary belong to the same club
- (b) A member of the LMC, including the League Secretary and Records Secretary, may not be present during a discussion or vote on any issue concerning his or her club, unless personally involved, when he or she may give evidence.
- 3 The League Secretary shall:
 - (a) Have the discretion to admit new teams into the bottom division not later than 31 December
 - (b) Receive notification of disputes, call LMC meetings, prepare witnesses and collect relevant information
 - (c) Send entry forms for the following season to all clubs by 15 June.
- 4 The Records Secretary shall:
 - (a) Validate match results, send them to the grading officer and bulletin editor, and compile league tables
 - (b) Deal as he or she deems most equitable with incorrectly formulated results.

5 Rule alterations:

- (a) Alterations to these rules may be made only at an annual Rules Revision Meeting
- (b) No later than 31 March, the Association Secretary shall call the meeting to be held normally in the first half of June
- (c) Proposals must be submitted in writing not less than 35 days before the meeting to the Association Secretary, who shall circulate them to all association officers and club secretaries at least 21 days before the meeting
- (d) The proposer and seconder must be from different clubs.

Schedule B: The League

- I The season is from I September to I May and clubs must be affiliated to the NCA before entry into the League.
- 2 Clubs must, by 15 July, return the completed entry form to the League Secretary.

- 3 A team must immediately notify the League Secretary and all captains in that team's division of a change to the venue, the team captain or his or her details.
- 4 If two or more teams from the same club play in the same division, the first match of the club's two highest teams in that division shall be between them. Matches between teams from the same club must be played by 31 January.
- A team not completing at least half of its fixtures shall have its record deleted and be regarded as having withdrawn.
- 6 Final positions of teams in a division will be determined by match points (win = 2 points, draw = 1, loss = 0); game points; results between tied teams (match points; game points) fewest defaulted boards and playoff matches at a neutral venue, which if drawn will be decided by board count; bottom board elimination; toss of a coin by a neutral LMC member.
- 7 All matches must start at 7:15 pm or 7:30 pm as notified by the home club unless both team captains have agreed an alternative time. The home team will ensure the equipment is properly laid out at the agreed time of starting.
- 8 A match will be defaulted by any team that fails to field at least half the number of players scheduled to play in a match.
- 9 A team that defaults a match must provide an explanation to the Records Secretary or League Secretary within 7 days.
- 10 All games must be played with chess clocks.
 - (a) The time limit shall be 30 moves in 60 minutes in the bottom division, or 35 moves in 75 minutes in all other divisions, after which the clocks will be set back 15 minutes and the game played to a finish
 - (b) Where electronic clocks are proposed for use, either player may provide an analogue clock and insist on its use
 - (c) Where electronic clocks are used, the required time periods must be set at the beginning of the match, so that no further adjustment of the clocks is required.
- II Each match must be played over 4 boards in the bottom division and over 5 boards in all other divisions.
- 12 Before the start, the captains must exchange team lists. The away team shall have white on the odd-numbered boards.
- 13 The Laws of Chess, as interpreted by FIDE, must be adhered to. Exceptions or additions to these laws:
 - (a) English descriptive notation is permitted
 - (b) Smoking must not be permitted in the playing area during the match
 - (c) Mobile phones must be switched off or, by prior agreement with the opponent and opposing captain, set to silent
 - (d) If a player fails to arrive at the board within 30 minutes of the clock being started, that board shall be defaulted unless a qualified substitute is found in the meantime.

- 14 Each captain must email, post or personally deliver the result to the Records Secretary within 7 days.
- 15 Fixture rearrangements:
 - (a) A captain seeking to rearrange must inform the opposing captain and seek permission from the League Secretary
 - (b) If the League Secretary decides there is a compelling reason for rearrangement then, no later than 14 days after the scheduled fixture, the team captains must agree a new date and inform the League Secretary; otherwise the League Secretary may choose the date.

Schedule C: Players

- I The LMC may penalise any club that uses a player who is not, in the opinion of the LMC, a bona fide member of that club.
- 2 A player may only play one game in any one evening, including wins by default.
- 3 No player may play in the League for more than one club in any one season except at the discretion of the LMC.
- 4 No player may play for a club lower team if he (or she) has, previously in the same season, played twice for higher teams other than on the bottom two boards played. If a club has more than one team in the first division, each such team shall be considered the higher team for the purposes of this rule.
- 5 All appearances above the bottom two boards played will count for eligibility even if that team fails to complete its fixtures.
- 6 New players:
 - (a) A club wishing to field a player new to that club must inform the Records Secretary of the player's grading code and grade, date of birth (juniors only) and details of clubs or counties previously played for
 - (b) If a player has not previously played in the league and does not reside, work or study in Nottinghamshire, and is graded or of estimated strength of over 150, he

or she cannot play for the club until the above information has been supplied and permission has been granted by the LMC. Otherwise the information must be provided with the result of his or her first match for the club.

Schedule D: Penalties

- I The penalty for infringing rule B3, B4, B12 or B15(a) is the loss of the match by default.
- 2 The penalty for infringing rule B10, B13, C2, C3, C4 or C6 is the loss of the game by each offending player.
- 3 The penalty for infringing rule B7 is a time penalty on the clocks of the offending team equal to the period of delay.
- 4 The penalty for infringing rule B2 is a fine of £20.
- 5 The penalty for infringing rule B14 is a fine of £1 in respect of each infringement.
- 6 The penalty for playing an ineligible player in a match is the transfer of one game point from the offending team to their opponents, in addition to any other penalty, provided that the total game score of a team shall not become negative.
- 7 The penalty for defaulting a match is the loss of two match points and a fine of £10, in addition to any other penalty imposed. The LMC may take any action it deems equitable if defaulted matches affect promotion or relegation.
- 8 The penalty for infringing rule B9 is the loss of two more match points by the team concerned.
- 9 Defaults that occur above the bottom board played will incur not only the loss of that game but also the transfer of 0.5 game points from the offending team to their opponents.
- 10 The LMC may revoke or reduce any of the above penalties if the club penalised can show to the Committee that the infringement was due to circumstances not reasonably within the club's control.

League Guide to the Laws of Chess

This guide is largely an edited version (to fit on I page) of the piece written by Neil Graham in *Notts News* No. 12 (2007/08) and is intended to cover those problems that may arise in a league match, where there is no arbiter present.

(a) Keeping a game score (Article 8)

You must write your game down move by move, except when in time trouble (see below). You may reply to your opponent's move before recording it. It is forbidden to write down a move in advance, except when claiming a draw by repetition.

If a player has less than five minutes left on his clock at some stage in a period... then he is not obliged to meet the requirements of Article 8.1. Immediately after one flag has fallen the player must update his scoresheet completely before moving a piece on the chessboard.

So if you are in time trouble you don't have to maintain a scoresheet if you have less than five minutes on your clock. Once a flag has fallen you must get your scoresheet up to date. In practice in a League match you'd be expected to make up your scoresheet in your own time; normal procedure and courtesy is to do that using your opponent's scoresheet. That is covered in Article 8.5b. This part of the law also covers what happens if both players are in time-trouble. Once one flag has fallen the clocks should be stopped and the scoresheets brought up to date, reconstructing on a second chessboard if necessary.

(b) Claiming a draw by three times repetition (Article 9) You may only claim the when it is your turn to move. If the position has just appeared claim the draw. If the position will appear with your next move write the move on your scoresheet, declare your intention to play that move and claim the draw. Do not make the move at the board – this renders the claim invalid. If the claim is disputed stop the clock,set up on another board and check. If the claim is correct the game is drawn, and if not there is a time penalty.

(c) Illegal moves

Covered in Article 7.4. If a player makes an illegal move, his opponent is awarded two minutes extra time in the first two instances; for a third illegal move by the same player the game is lost.

(d) The chess clock

Use of the clock is covered under Article 6. Firstly please note that under 6.8 – the players must handle the chess clock properly. It is forbidden to punch it forcibly, to pick it up or to knock it over. Article 6.9 is very important in League play. A flag is considered to have fallen when either player has made a valid claim to that effect. So to win on time you must made a claim to that effect and show that your opponent's flag has fallen.

(e) Conduct of players

Article 12 refers. Item 12.2 bars mobile phones. I always ask players to turn off phones before the start of a match and Article 13.7 tells us that players in other games are not to speak about or otherwise interfere in a game. So please remember you must not tell players they have lost/won on time, have reached the time control, should play for a win or

draw, should accept an offer of a draw, that the opponent is not keeping score or has made an illegal move, or anything else. This is interference.

(f) Quickplay finish

Where games are played as in Article 10, a player may claim a draw when he has less than two minutes left on his clock and before his flag falls. This concludes the game.

He may claim on the basis:

- (a) that his opponent cannot win by normal means. and/or
- (b) that his opponent has been making no effort to win by normal means.
- In (a) the player must write down the final position and his opponent verify it.

In (b) the player must write down the final position and submit an up-to-date scoresheet which must be completed before play has ceased. The opponent shall verify both the scoresheet and the final position. The claim shall be referred to an arbiter whose decision shall be the final one.

The difficult positions usually occur where the player with the advantage is short of time. In such situations you can play for a win and risk losing on time, or play for a draw. Some tips on playing for a draw.

- (a) The earlier you decide to play for a draw the more likely you are to get it. It should be a positive decision to go for the draw. "Playing for a win while keeping the draw in hand" is playing for a win and you risk losing on time.
- (b) Offer a draw. This clearly shows your intentions.
- (c) Aim for a fortress demonstrating your opponent cannot win by normal means.
- (d) Repetitions can be useful. They show you are not playing for a win. It now requires your opponent to show that they are making an effort to win by normal means (which would not be the case if you were trying to win and they were just defending your threats)
- (e) Remember to complete the scoresheet. In doubtful cases you may not be able to demonstrate your opponent cannot win by normal means, where only the final position matters. This gives you a second chance.
